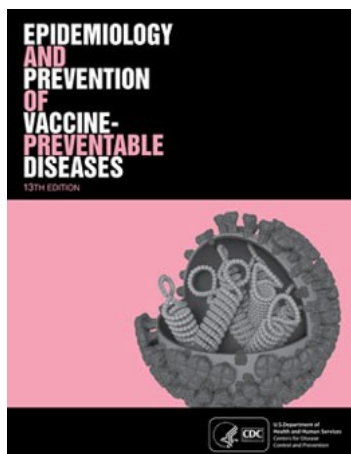
## 2017 Pink Book Course
